

Health and Safety

To protect the health and safety of patrons, performers, volunteers, and staff, the Cerritos Center for the Performing Arts (CCPA) is following all recommendations and requirements from public health officials.

Vaccination or Negative COVID-19 Test Required

In compliance with the Los Angeles County Health Officer Order (Public Health), everyone attending performances at the CCPA must show proof of full COVID-19 vaccination or a negative COVID-19 viral test result. Attendees must also present a government-issued photo I.D. Proof of vaccination can include your vaccination card or a photo of your vaccination card. Attendees who are not fully vaccinated must provide proof of a negative COVID-19 test taken within 72 hours prior to the performance. The following are acceptable as proof of a negative COVID-19 viral test result: printed document (from the test provider or laboratory) or an email or text message displayed on a phone from the test provider or laboratory. These documents will be checked at the entrances to the CCPA for every performance. Face Coverings Required

Everyone must wear a face covering when they are inside the CCPA and will be required to comply with any additional public health mandates at the time of the event. When attending an indoor event in close contact with people who may not be vaccinated, Public Health recommends wearing a higher level of protection, such as two masks or a respirator (KN95 or N95). Masks may be removed when eating or drinking at one of the CCPA's refreshment areas. Children under the age of 2; people who cannot safely wear a mask, such as someone who is unable to remove a mask without help; and anyone instructed not to wear a mask by their medical provider are not required to wear a mask.

Additional Safety Measures

The CCPA's heating, ventilation, and air conditioning system has been upgraded with MERV-13 filters. In addition to the usual thorough cleaning processes, high-touch areas in the CCPA are disinfected before each performance and during intermission. Hands-free hand sanitizer dispensers are available to patrons at each entrance to the CCPA.

Staff and volunteers have been advised to stay home if they are not feeling well. If you do not feel well, have exhibited symptoms of COVID-19, have tested positive for COVID-19 or have been in contact with an infected person within 10 days prior to the performance, please stay home and contact the Ticket Office for a refund or exchange.

The CCPA will continue to carefully monitor the health and safety protocols recommended by public health agencies and adjust practices as necessary to protect patrons, performers, volunteers, and staff. The CCPA reserves the right to alter safety protocols at any time and at its sole discretion as deemed appropriate. Public Health states there is a risk of COVID-19 exposure when attending large, crowded events where the vaccine status of other attendees may be unknown. There is also a risk for people who may not currently be eligible for vaccination or may be immunocompromised and whose vaccine protection may be incomplete. By visiting the CCPA, you voluntarily assume all risks related to exposure to COVID-19.
